If students contribute with learning materials and ideas and share them with the others it will create a substantial benefit for everybody. There is plenty of resources, opportunities and interesting news everywhere, that can complement the learning process. Therefore I try to instruct students to use WIKI systems as collaboration system. I use most www.wikispaces.com. The most important thing is that students feel owners of this process and do not attend to be instructed to share something or not. However it is really a long learning process - to change their mind to contribute to the class. Albena'
- Krassen Stefanov** (63 days ago): 'When adapting learning material, I am using the same type of tool used for the creation of the learning material. In practice, I am using mainly text editors (like Open Office, MS Office or PDF editor), presentation editors (HTML or power point editors for example) and graphics image editors.'
